### Terrorism and Technology: New Challenges for our Military

**MAJOR GENERAL (RET) MICHAEL HALL '68** Major General Hall is a 1968 Cornell Air Force ROTC graduate. In a distinguished 27-year military career, General Hall logged over 4,500 hours in high performance fighter aircraft. His many assignments included command of the 174th Tactical Fighter Wing, where he introduced the F-16 fighter to Close Air Support. During the first Gulf War he served as Senior Allied Air Liaison Officer, and was promoted to Major General. He retired in 1995, and is now a partner in PFA Consulting, specializing in leadership and organizational development. He also serves as Manager of the Ithaca-Tompkins Regional Airport.
